



Sutro Tower transmits TV signals for the City. (July 2002)




Chesnut Street in the Presidio District is filled with restaurants and nightlife. (February 2007)




#### Fort Mason








The Roth Family bought the block in 1962 and opened a retailrestaurant complex in 1964. The Ghirardelli plant moved to San Leandro. (July 2011)

The Eureka was an auto ferry that carried cars from Sausalito to the Hyde Street pier before the Bridge was built. (July 2002)











Fisherman's Wharf is visited by 12 million tourists a year. (July 2010)














Dungeness Crab is plentiful in the San Francisco area. Dungeness Crab is found along the West Coast of North America. About one quarter of the weight of the crab is meat.
