
Alameda County


This is an example of the new apartment block housing in the community. (June 2003)



Old factories are being cleaned up and put to new uses. (June 2009)












A lot of public art has been added to the city landscape. The city maintains an art walk that is outlined on its website. (June 2009)







These art pieces appear in the large shopping center on the Oakland border . There is also an IKEA and a Home Depot. (June 2009)

























Novartis, a drug company, has rehabbed old buildings and built new ones in their large complex. Every thing is very artistic. (June 2009)














A large design school, Ex'pression, has been established in a plain warehouse complex. (June 2009)
























Alameda Naval Air Station
