


Contra Costa County























The Antioch City Hall. Antioch was founded in 1850 and became an incorporated city in 1872. It has a population of 102,000. (March 2009)


















Oakley did not become a city until 1999. It had a post office beginning in 1898. Its population has grown to 35,000. (March 2009)
























Discovery Bay began as a planned community in 1964. Each house had its own dock. The population has now reached 13,000. The community is situated on the edge of the Delta. (April 2005)
