The town was incorporated in 1914. Today it has a population of 7,500.






The first post office arrived in 1894. The city incorporated in 1946. (July 2003)




Mendota





















Mendota Pool

Just outside of town is the Mendota Pool where the water from the Delta flows into the San Joaquin River. The water flows through the $1\,1\,7$ mile-long Delta Mendota Canal. (May 2007)

The reason water is brought from the Delta is that the San Joaquin River is dry by the time it reaches Mendota. All of the water has been diverted to 15,000 farms through the Kern and Madera Canals. (May 2007)


Three Rocks
