Population: 26,453 (Rank: 49)

Land Area (square miles): 1,315 (Rank: 36)

Glenn County was founded in 1891 out of the northern portion of Colusa County. It was named for Dr. Hugh Glenn.

Glenn County stretches from the Coast Range to the Sacramento River. The eastern third of the county is located in the Mendocino National Forest.

It is a farm area. Rice, dairy, almonds, dried plums, cattle, corn walnuts, hay, olives and sugar beets are the leading crops.

Interstate 5 cuts through the county. Highway 45 follows the west bank of the Sacramento River.

Cities: Willows, Orland. Towns: Hamilton City, Ordbend, Princeton, Glenn, Artois.

Introduction


California is comprised of 58 counties. The state, the third largest in the U.S., has the greatest diversity of geography of any of the states. It has huge deserts, high mountain ranges, fertile valleys and a 1000 mile coastline. Beginning in 2001 my wife and I began to travel and photograph the state as a retirement hobby.


