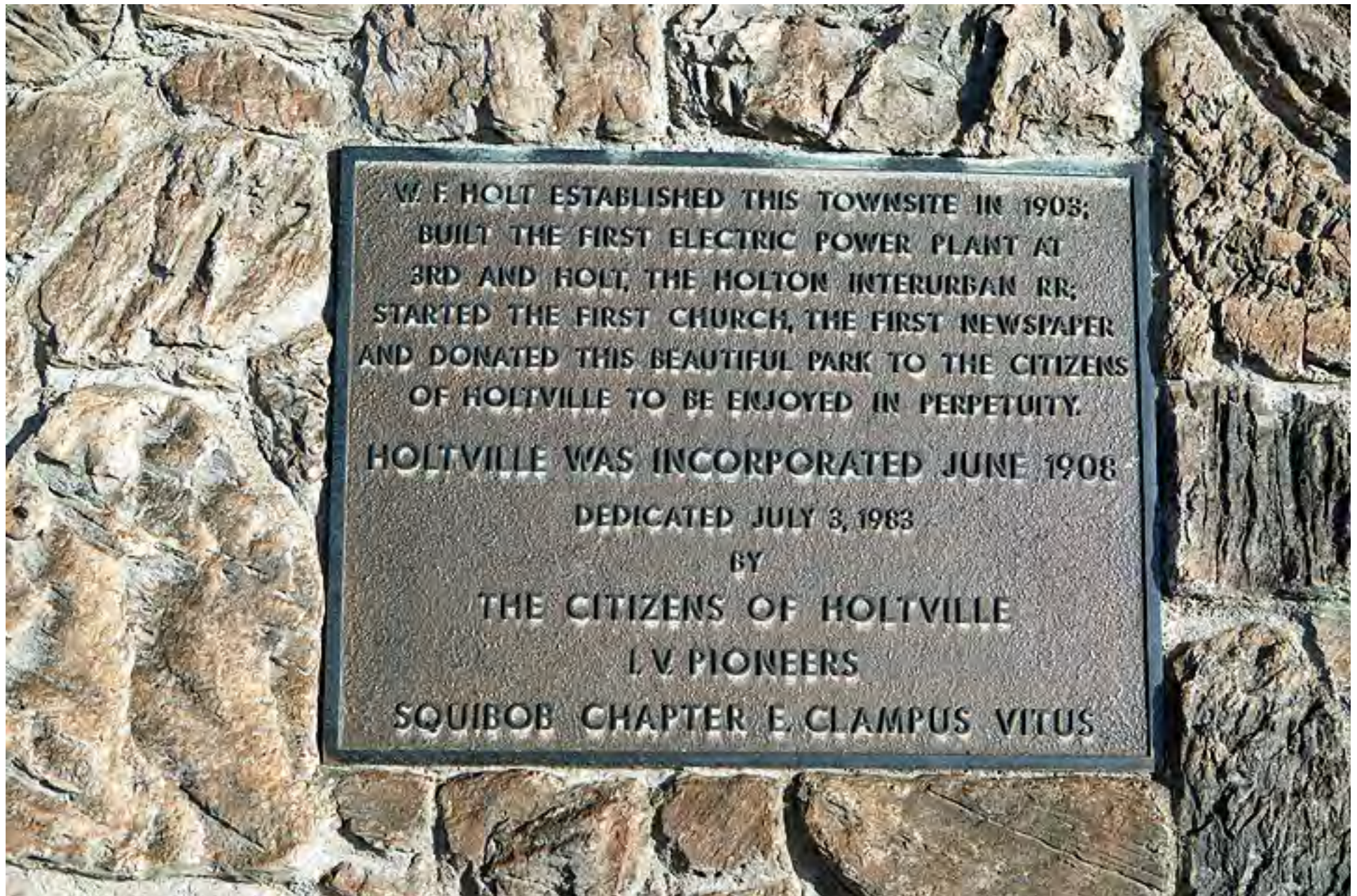

Calipatria is the lowest city in the Western Hemisphere – 184 feet below sea level. To commemorate this fact it has a flag pole 184 feet tall. (January 2003)
