

This was designed by Greene & Greene, the creators of the California bungalow design. This was for a Procter & Gamble heir. It was completed in 1908. (May 2005)





It was founded in 1924 as one of California's 110 community colleges. It is famed for its academics. (May 2005)




Pasadena runs its own public power and water systems. (May 2005)






Jackie and Mack Robinson

The 100 inch Hooker Telescope. It was the largest in the world from 1917 to 1948. (May 2005)




The Descanso Gardens was founded by E. Manchester Boddy in 1953. The 160 acre garden specializes in camellias. (May 2005)

























La Canada – Flintridge
