




The property was developed when Elias Baldwin bought the property in 1875. For a long time this was where Baldwain kept his race horses and maintained a hotel. (June 2011)



Los Angeles acquired the property in 1947 and opened the gardens in 1956. The gardens cover 127 acres. (June 2011)
































































This is the Reid Adobe and it was the first home on the property. This is where "Lucky" Baldwin stayed. (June 2011)
















This is Baldwin's stable. He raced his horses at Santa Anita. (June 2011)































There are 200 pea fowl in the aboretum. These are descendants from those imported by Lucky Baldwin in the 1880's. (June 2011)
