



Thom Mayne designed the environmentally friendly building. He won the Pritzker Architecture Award in 2005 for the structure. (December 2006)












The city hall was completed in 1928. It is 454 feet tall and was until 1964 the tallest building in the city. (August 2012)




Looking north from the City Hall. The Pueblo is on the right. (August 2012)




Red tile-roofed Union Station and the MTA building behind it. Long white building with tower at left is the post office. (August 2012)








The new police building, center; the Cal Trans building to the left and the LA Times to the right. This looks south. (August 2012)









This is looking south at the new police headquarters. Cal Trans is on the left and the LA Times is on the right. Note green bike lane at right. (August 2012)





Looking east along Highway 101. The large white building in the center background is the county hospital. The two windowless structures on each side of the freeway are jails. (August 2012)





This is the Spring St. entrance to the city hall. (August 2012)




The Council Chambers in the City Hall. The fellow to the right revealed that his great grandfather actually owned the property on which the city hall rests. (August 2012)













LAWP runs the power and water of Los Angeles. It is the third .largest public utility in the state. (December 2006)


