

The Korean Peace Bell was dedicated in 1976. The bell weighs 17 tons, is 8 inches thick and is 12 feet high. (December 2003)
























One of the old "Red Line" cars that once connected areas of the Los Angeles Basin to each other. It runs up and down the wharf. (December 2003)




















Vincent Thomas Bridge connects San Pedro with Terminal Island. It is 1,500 feet long. (December 2009)









This is one of four refineries in Wilmington which is next door to San Pedro. (December 2009)
