


The town was incorporated in 1915. It has a population of 24,000. It is the home of the naval munitions supply depot for the Pacific fleet. (December 2003)




Surfing is particularly good because of the influence of Catalina Island upon the waves. (July 2004)




















Dana Point began as a development in 1926. It incorporated as a city in 1989. The population is 33,000. (July 2004)
