Placer County Data Population: 248,399 (Rank: 56) Land Area (square miles): 1,404 (Rank: 23)

Placer County was created in 1851. The name is probably a contraction of the Spanish "plaza de oro" meaning the place of gold. Placer County is different from other Mother Lode counties in that it stretches down into the Sacramento Valley. It includes the valley towns of Roseville and Lincoln. The western part of the county has become a suburb of Sacramento and there is a growing industrial base.

Wood products, fabricated metal products and machinery lead the list of manufactures. Hewlett Packard has built a large plant between Roseville and Lincoln.

Timber production continues with the county producing 1.7% of the state's timber.

I-80 cuts though the county and most communities are located along this route. Highway 49 continues its north-south path through the county.

Cities: Lincoln, Roseville, Auburn, Colfax, Rocklin, Loomis. Towns: Penryn, Newcastle, Tahoe City, Squaw Valley.

Introduction

California is comprised of 58 counties. The state, the third largest in the U.S., has the greatest diversity of geography of any of the states.
