

The San Benito County Courthouse in Hollister. Part 2 of 3: Panoche Road, Tres Pinos, Paicines, Pinnacles, Highway 25.






The Panoche Road connects Interstate 5 with Highway 25 which follows the San Andreas Fault. (April 2005)

There are few bridges along the road. Creeks are crossed with paved fords like this one. (April 2005)









Landslides are a problem along this road. (April 2005)







Highway 25 follows the San Andreas Fault. There are some row crops but it is mostly range land. (April 2005)


















Tres Pinos has a population of 476 and dates back to the 1870's. (June 2012)











The National Monument was established by Theodore Roosevelt in 1908. It is known for its caves and bats. (June 2012)
