






Rancho Cucamonga now has a population of 165,000. It has no real center. When it was incorporated in 1977 it combined three suburban communities. (May 2004)
















Fontana

Colton is a railroad town that dates back to 1875. It has a population of 52,000. (December 2005)






This is the original McDonald's on Route 66 into town. (December 2005)













San Bernardino

The city became incorporated in 1857. It is the 17th largest city in California. It has a population of 210,000. It filed for bankruptcy in 2012. (February 2005)





