There are is a lot of river rock in the Santa Ana River – Mill Creek area. Many of the older homes are built of rock. (December 2005)






Rim of the World





Lake Arrowhead is an old mountain resort that dates back to the 1920's. (December 2005)
















Lake Silverwood


This is a little resort community that sits on top of the San Bernardino mountains. (December 2005)




