# San Ysidro

San Ysidro was founded in 1908 as part of the Little Landers Movement. The movement was headed by William Smythe who believed that with irrigation people could support themselves on a small amount of land. Tujunga, near Los Angeles, was another Little Landers community. The community ended in 1916 when a flood wiped out the farms.
