






Creston has only 94 people. It was founded in 1884. It is on Highway 229. (August 2005)






















I drove Hwy 229 from Creston to Santa Margarita without seeing a car. (August 2005)





Santa Margarita

Santa Margarita was founded in 1889 as the railroad was gradually built to San Luis Opisbo. Today's population is 1,259. (August 2005)



Santa Margarita

The entrance to one of the last remaining Mexican Ranchos. The ranch still has 13,900 acres. When it was established in 1841 it was close to 18,000 acres. (August 2005)













Carrizo Plain

These are pronghorn antelope grazing on the Carrizo Plain. The 50 mile long plain is considered original California prairie. The San Andreas Fault runs through this valley. It is now a national monument. (May 2006)





Carrizo Plain

At the north end of the plain is Soda Lake. This lake expands with the winter rains and contracts as the water evaporates leaving a salt crust. (May 2006)











Highway 166 connects the San Joaquin Valley with Highway 101. (May 2006)
