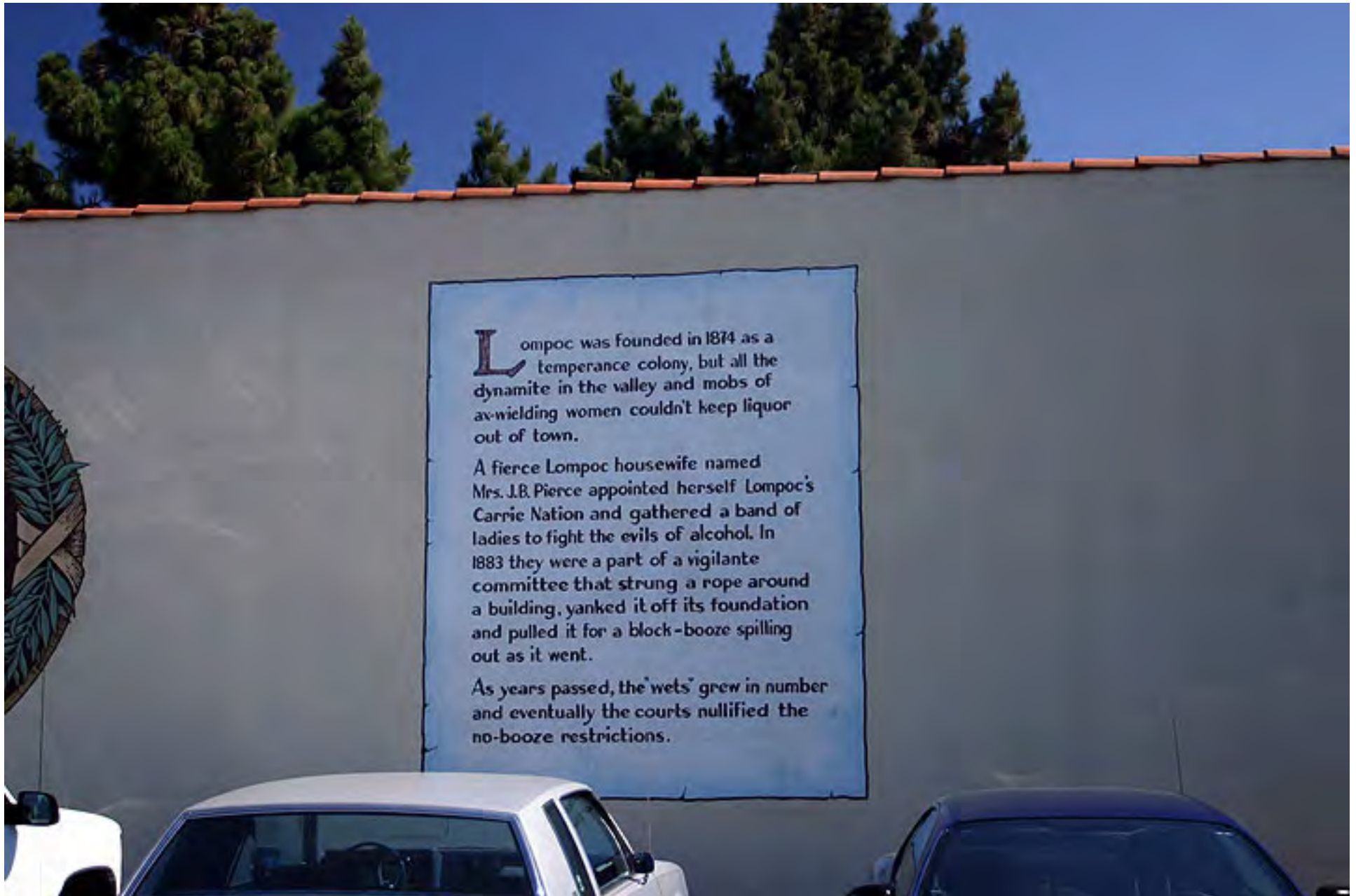

Lompoc was founded in 1874 as a temperance colony, but all the dynamite in the valley and mobs of ax-wielding women couldn't keep liquor out of town.

A fierce Lompoc housewife named Mrs. J.B. Pierce appointed herself Lompoc's Carrie Nation and gathered a band of ladies to fight the evils of alcohol. In 1883 they were a part of a vigilante committee that strung a rope around a building, yanked it off its foundation and pulled it for a block-booze spilling out as it went.

As years passed, the "wets" grew in number and eventually the courts nullified the no-booze restrictions.

Violators Will be Cited
By order of the installation Commander



Beach and dune areas beyond fences to the south of this access are off limits March 1 - September 30 to protect Western Snowy Plovers, listed as Threatened under the Endangered Species Act.

VIOLATORS WILL BE SUBJECT TO FINES UP TO \$5,000, THE DESTRUCTION OR HARM TO SNOWY PLOVERS, THEIR EGGS OR YOUNG MAY RESULT IN CIVIL PENALTIES UP TO \$25,000 OR CRIMINAL PENALTIES UP TO \$50,000 AND/OR ONE YEAR IN PRISON.

MARCH 1 - SEPTEMBER 30

- No pets on beach (outside this period, all pets must be on leash and under physical control at all times.)
- No beach fires (outside this period, fires by permit only from Vandenberg Fire Marshal.)
- No horses (except for authorized enforcement patrols)
- No off-road vehicles including bicycles (except for authorized security enforcement.)
- No wind-surfing, parasailing, or feeding of wildlife.
- No stinging, kite flying, camping, fireworks.

- Prohibidos los caballos (excepto caballos patrullas)
- Prohibidos los vehículos de todo terreno (inclusive las bicicletas), excepto las autorizadas para seguridad/patrullas
- Prohibido dar de comer animales silvestres.
- Prohibido los fuegos artificiales, fier bielas, volar cometas, acampar.
