
# **Ventura County**

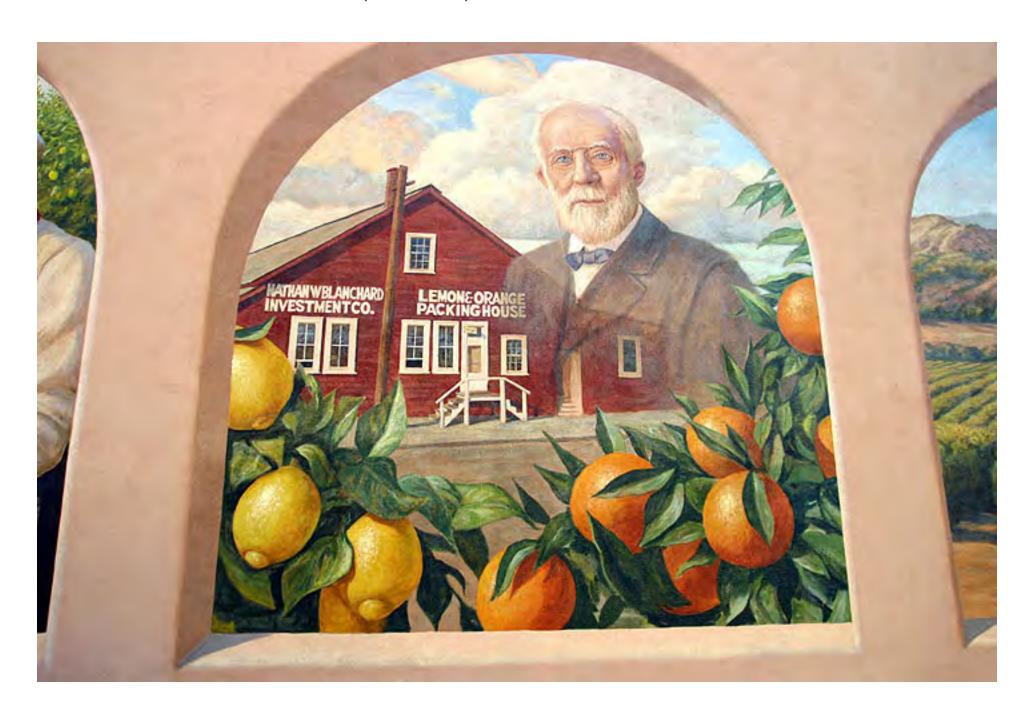
#### Santa Paula

Piru was founded in 1887 by religious publisher David Cook. He wanted to create a second "Garden of Eden." (March 2004)



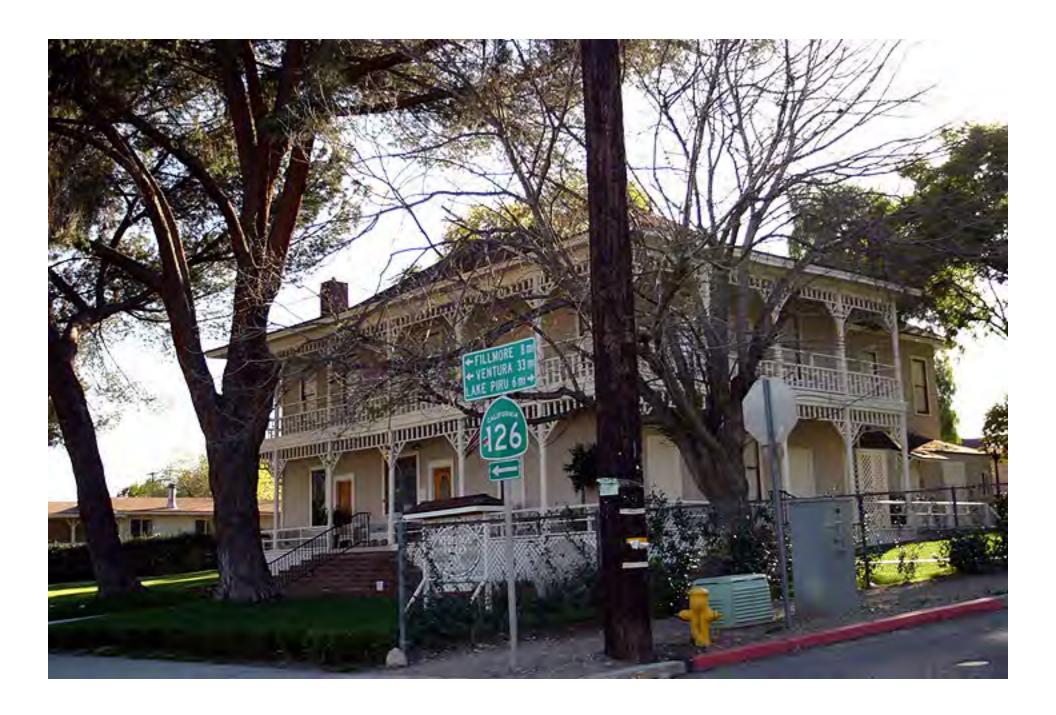

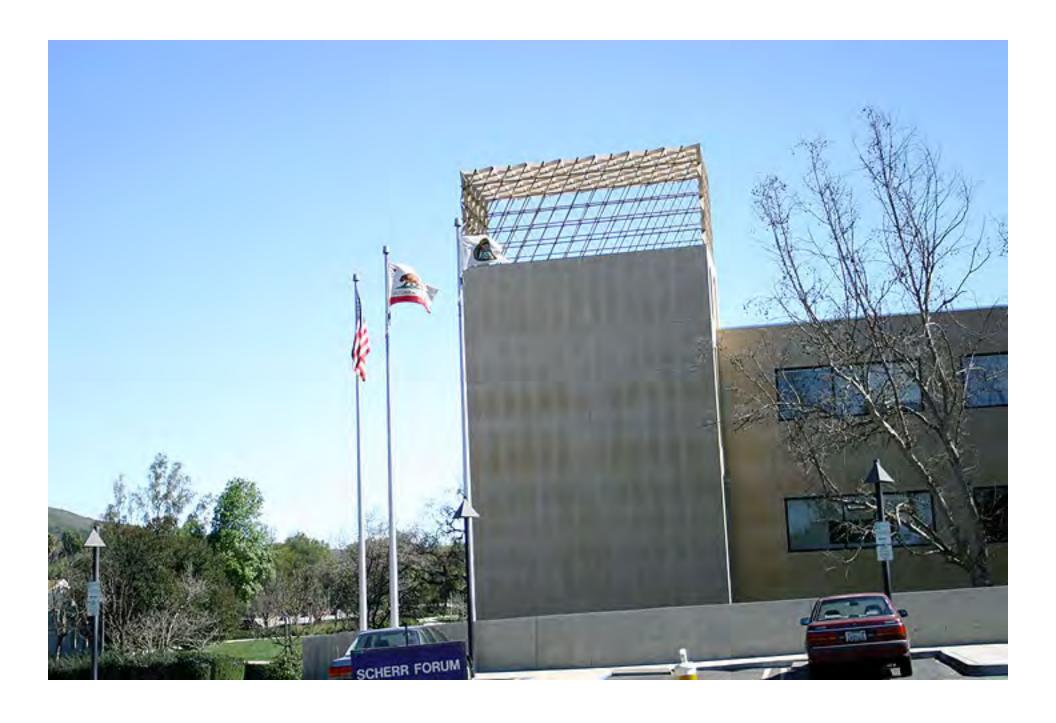
